Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.
Mr. Bond, Manager of C. & P. Telephone Company, appeared before council and presente proposed telephone franchise. On motion by W.G. Stallard, seconded by G.E. Hunnicutt and carried by unanimous vote council moved that the following resolution be passed: BE ITERESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTON, WISE COUNTY, VIRGINIA, 4949 that the annexed ordinance, entitled "AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO , ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, TO USE THE STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF NORTON, VIRGINIA, FOR ITS POLES, WIRES, CONDUITS, CABLES AND FIXTURES," be advertised once a week for four successive weeks in the Coalfield Progress, a newspaper published in the City of Norton, Virginia, and have a general circulation in the City of Norton; and that said advertisement shall invite bids for the franchise proposed to be granted in said Ordinance, which bids are to be in writing and delivered to the presiding officer of the Council in open session, to be held in Council Chamber, on the day of 19 69, at 7:30 o'clock, P.M., the right being reserved to reject any and all bids. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the invitation for bids to be published with said Ordinance shall be as follows: The City of Norton, Wise County, Virginia, hereby invites bids for the franchise proposed to be granted to the presiding Ordinance, duly passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on the day of, which bids are to be in writing and delivered to the presiding officer of the Council of said City in open session, to be held in Council Chamber in said City on the day of, 19, which bids are to be in writing and delivered to the presiding officer of the Council of said City in open session, to be held in Council Chamber in said City on the day of, 1969, at 7:30 o'clock, P.M., the right being reserved to reject any and all bids. Mr. Fred Forberg of State Map Department of Department of Taxation appeared before council and presented procedure for tax reappraisals for real estate in City of Norton.

Mr. Carroll Tate, Chairman, Norton Industrial Development Authority appeared before

council and presented the following resolution from the Development Authority:

The Norton Industrial Development Authority desires to keep U.S. Bureau of Mines in Norton and because of its need for expanded facilities the Norton Industrial Development Authority agrees to assist U.S. Bureau of Mines in locating such expanded facilities here by taking the necessary feasible steps to enter into an agreement with the U.S. Bureau of Mines, General Services Administration, or other appropriate Federal Agency to provide such facilities upon terms and conditions to be agreed upon as between the U.S. Bureau of Mines and/or General Services Administration and/or other appropriate Federal Agency and the Norton Industrial Development Authority and with the cooperation of appropriate City Officials. Norton Industrial Development Authority further recommends the immediate acquisition of the Coca-Cola Tract, the Earls Tract and the entire Godwin Tract located on Kline Avenue in the City of Norton.

Mr. George Scott Appeared before council regarding reduction in rate of truck 4953 tags.

On motion by G. E. Hunnicutt, seconded by W. G. Stallard and carried by unanimous roll call vote council moved that the City Manager request the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance amending truck tag ordinance to read maximum amount of \$12.00 each, effective 4954 next tag year.
