

January 9, 1967

A special meeting of the Norton City Council was held on Monday, January 9th at 4:00 P. M. in the Civic Room of the Municipal Building.

Present: Vernon Flanary, George Hunnicutt, C.W. Bryant, R.L. Collins, S.H. Neeley, David B. Norman, James Roberson

The bids for two new police cars were discussed. Sam Neeley moved that the #3900 bid be awarded to the low bidder, Norton Motor Inn, and that the City retain the 1958 Chevrolet, not accepting the \$200 trade-in offered. The motion was seconded by George Hunnicutt and carried unanimously.

Discussion was held regarding the appointment of members to the newly formed #3901 Industrial Development Authority. A motion was made by Sam Neeley that the following individuals be appointed to the Norton Industrial Development Authority for the following terms, effective January 1, 1967:

The motion was seconded by Bob Collins and carried unanimously.

Discussion was held on the increase of the appropriation for the City #3902 Schools. Sam Neeley moved that the General Fund Budget be amended as follows:

Decrease:	State Sales Tax	\$5,600
Increase:	City Sales Tax	\$6,600
Increase:	Sale of Labor and Materials	\$6,000

Motion was seconded by George Hunnicutt and passed unanimously.
