The rescheduled meeting of the Norton City Council was held on Tuesday, October 29, 2013 at 6:00 p.m. in the Municipal Council Chambers with Mayor William Mays presiding.

Present: William Mays, Joseph Fawbush, and Terry Roop

Absent: Mark Caruso and Joseph Hunnicutt

Also Present: Fred L. Ramey, Jr., City Manager and Bill Bradshaw, City Attorney

The invocation was given by Father Tim Drake and was followed by the pledge led by Fire Chief D. C. Mullins and members of the Norton Fire Department.

Upon a motion by Councilman Fawbush, seconded by Councilman Roop, and passed	
by unanimous vote, Council moved to adopt the minutes of the October 1, 2013 meeting	25943
as presented.	

There was no response to the Mayor's call for visitors. 25944

Mr. Ramey advised Council that as of October 27th the City has a combined total in both reservoirs of 78.3 million gallons. At their previous meeting, the combined total was 92 million gallons. The City Administration continues to closely monitor this situation and will keep Council informed.

The City Manager recognized Fire Chief D. C. Mullins who presented Council with a list of the working officers of the Department for the fiscal year 2013/2014. He advised the only change on this list was the addition of a fourth lieutenant, Tim Couch. He asked Council's support in approving this group of volunteers.

Chief Mullins then introduced each member that was present and advised Council that they represent many years of service to the City and the Department.

Mayor Mays thanked each member for their years of dedicated service to the City as did Councilmen Fawbush and Roop.

Upon a motion by Councilman Roop, seconded by Councilman Fawbush, and passed by unanimous vote, Council moved to approve the list of working officers for the fiscal year 2013/2014 as presented by Fire Chief Mullins. At this time, a standing ovation and round of applause was given to the firefighters.

Mr. Wally Witt, the City's representative to the Cumberlands Airport Commission, was present to give Council an update. Mr. Witt handed each member of Council a booklet on Virginia's Airport System.

At this time, Councilman Hunnicutt took his seat on Council.

He advised that the airport was established by an act of the General Assembly in 1958, is classified as a regional airport for General Aviation, and gave a brief history. With the third longest runway in the 9th Congressional District, and after a recent economic impact


As you know, the City of Norton possesses a right-of-way through the property on which Norton Community Hospital ("the Hospital") is located. 15th Street is located on that right-of-way and there has been some slippage and water run-off which has resulted in the Hospital having to excavate and remediate a good portion of earth to address these issues. The Hospital wants to advise the repairs being contemplated are not to VDOT specifications. As you know, 15th Street is shown on City plans but it has never actually been constructed or maintained by the City. Also, the area that was built with the blessing of the City Council in 2011 now requiring repair was not constructed to VDOT specifications.


